Please review the following guidelines to help prepare students for the field trip:

- Since Lo'i Kalo Park is a special place, we will want to *kōkua* (help) to care for the native plants and animals living there. Please do not harm living things or pick plants unless guided to do so. (Note: Students may help to remove invasive alien plants under the supervision of the *kumu* at the site.)
- Clean the soles of your shoes before the field trip. That will help to prevent the spread of weeds that don't belong in the marsh or along the trails.
- It is important to show *hō'ihi* (respect) for this *wahi* (place) and for one another by treating all *kumu* and fellow students with respect.
- Volunteer *kumu* will be teaching each *hui* (group). Give your full attention to the *kumu* so everyone benefits from the experience.
- We'll be working in three groups. Stay with your group and do not wander off.
- Place all of your belongings, including bottled water in a backpack so that your hands will be free.
- Optional: We may want to share a (*mele*) song, an *oli* (chant) or a dance when we arrive.

To reach the entrance to Lo'i Kalo Park from Likelike Highway, merge onto Kalihi Street and turn right at North School Street. Then turn right at Lo'i Kalo Place (where Mexico Restaurant and Mitsuken is located).

From Pali Highway, exit onto Nu'uānu Avenue and turn right at North Judd Street. Continue on Lanakila Avenue and turn right at North School Street. Then turn left at Lo'i Kalo Place.
